HANDS ON HISTORY SPECIAL PROGRAMS FOR SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS



Lives and Wives of American Presidents

The American presidents will come alive as your students don period clothing. Students will use their counting and measuring skills as they handle objects from different historical periods. Students will use coins to recognize their presidents (Washington, Roosevelt, and Lincoln) and practice making change.

Flags Over Time

Symbols are everywhere. Students will seek out symbols throughout the museum in their quest for more knowledge. Students will learn the history of the flag and have the opportunity to fly it, observe it, and fold it. Paying close attention to the motions and movement of the flag, students will experience the proper folding and handling of this precious object. Students will explore the symbology of the Bald Eagle, American Flag, Statue of Liberty, and Pallas Athene.

Weighing in History

Your students will be thrilled to participate in a hands on activity that allows them to use their math skills as they examine artifacts. Students will use traditional and non-traditional measuring devices to determine weight and volume. Students will learn the purpose of artifacts and participate in contrasting and comparing objects. The teacher will have the opportunity to choose a time period from the American Revolution or Colonial Period, Civil War, China and Egypt, or the history of Women for this lesson.

Bugles and Beats
